SUMMARY

ICAT and the Moss Arts Center seek collaborators to provide content for an outdoor projection project on the Moss Arts Center in the fall of 2020.

Content should focus on the theme FLIGHT AND REFUGE, words that touch on international geo-political issues like migration and national borders. From the exuberance of ideas that take wing to the challenges of war survival and personal experiences of immigration, FLIGHT AND REFUGE suggests that maps reveal our current challenges--and the distance we've travelled; it is the theme for the Moss Arts Center's 20-21 season.

Proposals exploring the interplay between technology, maps, personal migration stories, and data are some of the ways creative researchers can explore the theme. Projects should involve several students lead by a faculty member. Content collaborators will work with specialists from the Moss Arts Center and ICAT, who will provide technical support and expertise to bring the vision to life.

Final projection content should be from 30 seconds to 5 minutes. No audio should be included as part of the proposal or planned content.

Winning proposals will be shown on the North Tower (facing Turner Street) of the Moss Arts Center from November 5-21, 2020, 3-4 nights per week from 7:00-10:00 PM. Alternate locations on the Moss Arts Center may also be considered in proposals.

The Moss Arts Center and ICAT will provide projectors and professional staff support.

- Funds will be awarded to the PI's home department unless otherwise authorized by ICAT. All project expenses must be posted to Banner within 30 days of the project's end date.
- Unspent funds must be transferred back to ICAT within 45 days of the project's end date.
- Funds will not be awarded for conference travel, food, outside artist fees, or honorariums.
- Funds may be used for equipment, software, materials, student time
